As we navigate through the transforming economic landscape with record vacancy numbers, it's never been more challenging to attract and retain talent.

Whilst the events from the last two years have been a catalyst for change, it has been a time of reflection for many businesses within Manufacturing - with the reality being that the demand for talent has had an impact on compensation packages.

The Executive Network Group has created this salary report to enable organisations to benchmark average salaries by region within 12 senior appointment job titles, within four sub-sectors of Manufacturing across the UK.

Our data sample from November 2021 is compiled by collating over 700 confidential salary survey responses, cross referenced with over 6,000 online profiles, vacancy listings and salary comparison tools inclusive of Glassdoor, LinkedIn, Indeed and PayScale.

Within our salary report, we have divided the Manufacturing sector into four subsectors:

- Defence (inclusive of Land Systems, Aviation & Marine)
- FMCG (inclusive of Food & Drink, Chemicals, Paper & Packaging)
- Advanced Manufacturing (inclusive of Plastics, Metals, Machinery, Automation & Robotics)
- Transport (inclusive of Aerospace, Automotive, Highways & Rail)





I've noticed in HSE within manufacturing, salaries have increased significantly especially at advisor level which is closing the gap between advisor and manager salaries. Managers are reluctant to pay this new inflated salary as the skill set isn't necessarily improving. On top of that, manager salaries haven't really increased so they aren't wanting to move for the same money. Down the line I think we are going to therefore see manager salaries having to increase when those advisors are ready to make their next career move.


Flexible working hours are a big thing candidates want- in manufacturing home working isn't really an option as they need to be on site but candidates want flexibility over start and finish time.





Within Food Manufacturing and FMCG I have noticed a trend for higher salaries in low candidate markets, i.e. Engineering and Health & Safety. Clients are having to really increase their salaries, and compensation schemes to obtain the right talent.

There is also a real focus on Sustainability, from management all the way through to director roles. These roles are focusing on Sustainability from a Supply Chain/ Procurement piece, all the way through to innovation through the factory. This could mean bringing in Energy or Environmental focused roles, or even within the machinery themselves to be more efficient and green.

This is also leading into the products piece. For example, within Food Manufacturing, Plant based foods has been a hot topic for a while now where that has been a big concentration on texture and appearance, there's now a huge focus on nutrient dense plant based foods. Within packaging for example, there's a focus on recyclable materials as there has always been, but now there is a focus on design and using Recyclable and Plant-able or biodegradable material.

These trends are very welcome as a greener and kinder society is always going to be desirable.

It comes as no surprise that salaries in London are generally higher than the rest of the UK, with the cost of living in the capital city being nearly 60% higher than in other parts of the country.

There is a clear divide between the north and south parts of the UK, with southern regions tipping the scale. That said, there were a few disparities where northern regions of the UK reached very similar salary levels as the south. London consistently demonstrated the top of the average salary listings, with few anomalies, closely followed by the South East and the Midlands.

Gender disparity also plays a role in salary discrepancies, with women making up on average less than a third of the manufacturing industry as a whole. In many organisations, the gender pay gap is still a point of contention and research has shown that it can sometimes be explained by the fact that men often have higher levels of seniority, thus accounting for the generally higher salaries. However, the industry is changing as more and more women take on leading roles.

This salary survey hopefully provides an insight to leadership teams within the wider Manufacturing sector so that they can better understand the competitiveness of the compensation packages they provide.
