Renewable Energy Guarantees of Origin (REGO)

A scheme to provide transparency to consumers about the proportion of electricity that suppliers source from renewable generation in the form of certificates

How is it charged?

- For both Half-Hourly (HH) and Non-Half Hourly (NHH) the REGO premium will be shown and invoiced as a separate line item
- The charge will be applied at Energy at Meter (E@M) consumption

How will it appear on my invoice?

- REGO backed premium will appear on the invoice in the 'Consumption charges' section under a heading of 'Renewable Energy Guarantees of Origin (REGO)'
- The actual charge will be calculated against the total energy consumption for each individual Meter Point Administration Number (MPAN) and the charge will be shown for each invoice period

What are the key differences?

- At migration, for each MPAN that has REGO premium applied, the energy charge will be reduced by the REGO premium and the REGO premium will be shown and invoiced as a separate line item (the reduction only applies if you have REGO premium in your current prices)
- From your next energy charges period or renewal, REGO premium will be itemised separately on your quote
